From library to school: Cambridge Early Learning Center

When the new Southeast Branch Library was opened in the Hickory Hollow Mall development, Metro Nashville Public Schools (MNPS) acquired the old 11,000 square foot Library Branch building that was originally constructed in the 1990's.

MNPS designated this building as the new home of the <u>Cambridge Early</u> Learning Center and tasked Dowdle Construction Group (DCG) with its renovation.




In order for DCG to transform this building into a fully functioning preschool, the project included a full gut and remodel of the existing building and a 2,000+ square foot addition to house the school's kitchen. The Dowdle team also prepared the backyard area to install a playground. In addition to a kitchen and playground, every school needs a gathering place. The central area of the building, with a vaulted ceiling, was



The Cambridge Early Learning Center is a pre-kindergarten school that utilizes a Creative Curriculum, a research-based preschool curriculum that uses exploration and discovery as a way of learning.
